## II. REQUIRED PAPERWORK

All students are required to have the following paperwork before they may participate in official practice at Midview High School. All Forms are available on-line at [www.midviewk12.org](http://www.midviewk12.org) or in the Athletic Office.

- Valid Physical (Must be less than one year old)
- Signed Waiver Form and Athletic Code
- Emergency Medical Form (On-file with coach)

## III. ELIGIBILITY

All students must be eligible under both the OHSAA and Midview Schools eligibility standards. To be eligible in the current grading period, a student must do the following in the preceding grading period:

- **Passing at least the equivalent of 5 1-credit classes**
- **Achieve a GPA of 1.5**

To be eligible in the first grading period of 9th grade, a student must do the following in the final grading period of eighth grade:

**Pass 75 % of all classes in the final grading period and achieve a 1.5 GPA during that same period**

## IV. SELECTION OF TEAM MEMBERS

Many teams at Midview High School do not release players from their roster. Some sports must release players due to numbers. Remember, being released from a team is based on many things, but the ultimate decision is made by the Head Coach with input from their assistants. Remember, playing for Midview is a privilege and not a right. Any questions about making a team at Midview should be answered by the Head Coach.

## V. TRAINER

Matt Yonkof is the Certified Athletic Trainer at Midview High School and is the person to see if you are injured playing a sport at Midview. He can direct you to the next step in your recovery process, and can refer you to Cleveland Clinic Doctors to further explore your injury. Please use Matt, as he is an outstanding trainer and advocate of Midview athletes.

## VI. EXTRA-CURRICULAR FEES

Unfortunately in Ohio, our funding is such that we must rely on the passage of school levies to fund our public schools. Due to recent failed attempts to pass a Midview levy, the School District has instituted the following extra-curricular fees: (Tier I Sports listed first)

High School—1st Sport = \$550  
High School—2nd Sport = \$100  
High School—3rd Sport = \$0

Middle School—1st Sport = \$325  
Middle School—2nd Sport = \$100  
Middle School—3rd Sport = \$0

If a student participates in Cheerleading, Skippers, or Cross-Country, these sports are considered Tier II sports because they are less costly than the other Midview sports. The Cost to participate in a Tier II Sport is \$250, and there will be other combinations of cost if a student participates in both Tier I and Tier II Sports.

All fees must be paid by the following dates. If fees are not paid by the below dates, a student may not play in any games until the fees are paid in full. More information will be available on our on-line forms:

Fall—August 15  
Winter—December 1  
Spring—April 1
