District Communications Program Comes to a Close June 30

As the Midview Board of Education moves forward with budget reductions, the Communications Program as it is now will soon end. The elimination of the district communications program will help the Board of Education with its goal of making \$1.2 million cuts to ensure the sustainability of District operations to meet the needs of students both now and in the future. Information on the Budget Reduction Process

The Midview Board of Education is moving forward with budget reductions to address the sustainability of District operations to meet the needs of students both now and in the future. Over the last two years, the Midview School District has made more than \$1 million in cuts and has nearly the lowest per pupil expenditures in northeast Ohio. In 2008, Midview made two attempts to pass new money into the district to protect the basic needs of our students. With those two levies voted down by the community, the district is in the process of making \$1.2 million in cuts from an already bare bones budget. In addition, the current recession has resulted in decreased property tax collections due to foreclosures and declining property values, decreased State aid, and declining interest rates, which further warrants the District's budget be aligned to meet diminished revenues.
