**Services for Gifted**

A plan of services was filed with the Ohio Department of Education on December 15, 2000. Full service is not required until the General Assembly or the State Superintendent of Public Instruction through law, rule, or as a condition for the receipt of funds decrees. The Midview School District is committed to implementing additional services as monies become available. Training for staff will be on-going so that gifted students are more appropriately served in regular classes.

Options may include the following:

**K-12**

- Differentiated curriculum in the regular classroom in area(s) of identified strengths
- Cluster grouping in the regular classroom of gifted children grades 3 through 6

**Elementary**

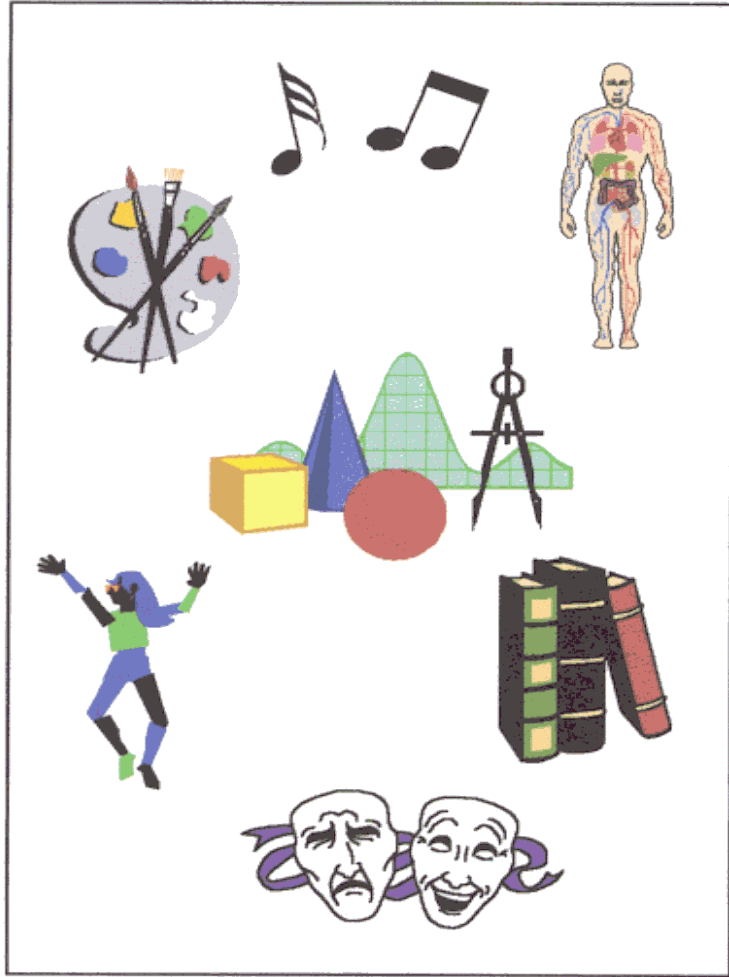
- Regular classroom teachers trained in gifted instruction work with cluster students grades 5-6

**Middle School**

- Self-Contained Classroom for Language and Reading, Grades 7-8
- Honors Classes for advanced students in Math

**High School**

- Mentorships
- Post-Secondary Enrollment at a College
- Advanced Placement Classes
- Honors Class
- Independent Study

## **Identification of Children who are Gifted**

The Midview School District believes that children who are gifted in the district must be provided opportunities to progress as their abilities permit. Midview further believes that these children require services that are differentiated in order to achieve their potential for contribution to themselves and society.

The Midview Board shall ensure equal opportunity for all children identified as gifted to receive any or all services offered by the district. Additional services will be made available when additional monies from the State of Ohio become available for gifted education.

Children are identified by professionally qualified persons using a variety of assessment procedures. The district will use testing instruments that have been approved by the Ohio Department of Education for screening, assessment, and identification.

### **Areas of Identification**

Children shall be identified in the following areas:

1. Superior Cognitive Ability
2. Specific Academic Ability including:
  - Reading, Writing, or a combination of these skills
  - Mathematics
  - Science
  - Social Studies
3. Creative Thinking Ability
4. Visual and/or Performing Arts Ability such as:

● Drawing	● Painting
● Sculpting	● Music
● Dance	● Drama
